Celebrating Learning

Next week, on Monday, teachers will send home to parents and whanau mid-year learning progress and achievement reports. Then, on Tuesday teachers will be available for Parent-Teacher-Student conferences.

It is appropriate at this time to reflect on all the effort and progress that children will have made over the first semester or half year of school. This is the mid-point evaluation of learning, and it provides a good indicator for continued progress in the second semester.

Teachers provide detailed evaluation of each child's engagement in the learning process and will be able to talk further about this with parents at the conferences. We aim for children to also be able to talk about their learning. In schools this is called developing student agency, with children being more aware and involved in understanding their learning progress and next steps.



Teachers also provide an indication of how well children are meeting general expectations for their Year Level. We indicate **Above**, **At** or **Below** Expectations. Most teachers would say this information is less important for the child than the detailed evaluation of effort and achievement, and the comments written by the teacher about the child's attitude and social development.

Please celebrate your child's success when you receive the written report and when you meet with the teacher. **Tell them you are proud of their effort.**



Please remember that school is closed on Tuesday 6 July for the 3 Way conferences to take place.

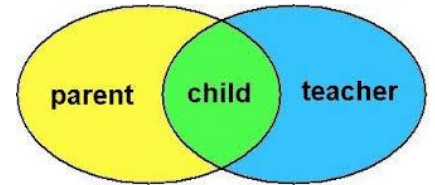
Parents will need to make arrangement for their children to stay home except when they come to school for their conference.

The book fair will be open all week in the library.

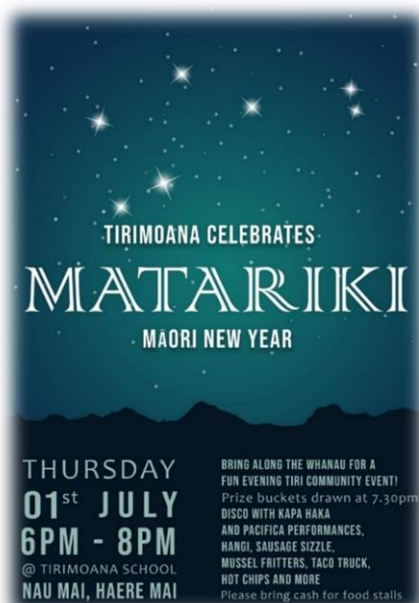


You are welcome to buy a book for your child, and we encourage you to buy a book to donate to our school library.

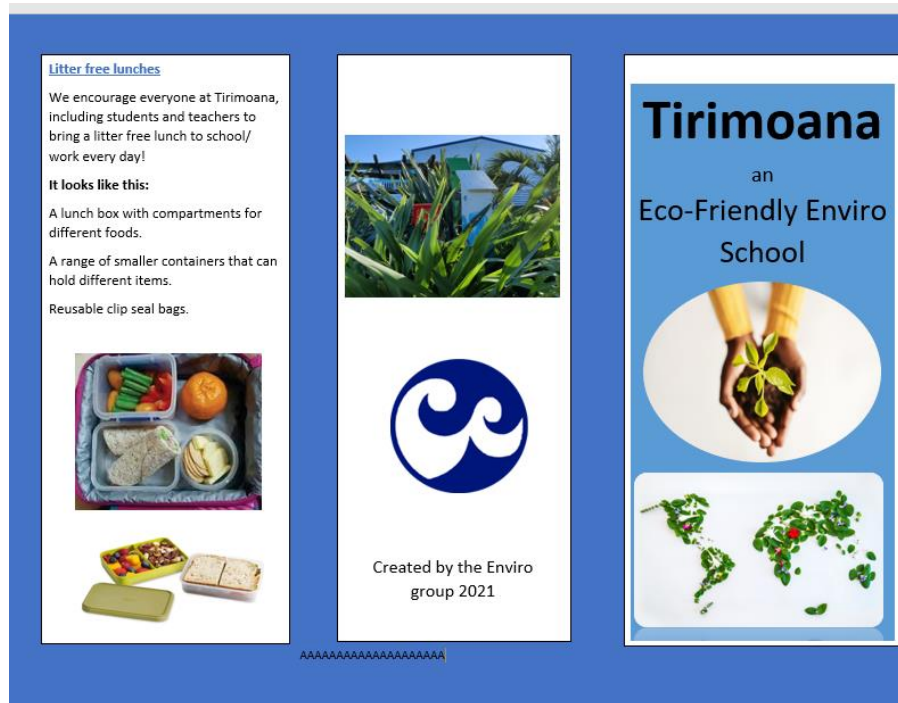



Enviro Pamphlet

It was inspired by a visit from Para kore ki Tamaki (a branch of Zero Waste) who informed us about up to date recycling practices. We have connected this to what we do at Tirimoana and how we are making a difference in our school.

The School Gates

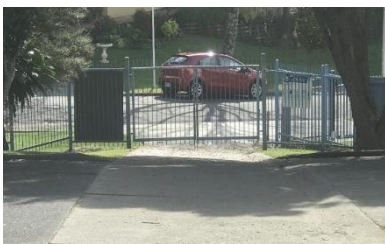


We take the safety of the children at Tirimoana School very seriously.


