

#### This week's PB4L Focus: Kindness and Compassion



The behaviour we have been focusing on this week is linked to our school-wide CARE values. Kindness and compassion are so important in the classroom and playground. Students can show kindness by:

- Saying hello and introducing yourself
- Asking someone to play
- Looking after people that are sad or hurt
- Knowing that we can be friendly but don't have to be friends that play together everyday.

#### **Celebrating Learning**

Next week, on Monday, teachers will send home to parents and whanau mid-year learning progress and achievement reports. Then, on Tuesday teachers will be available for Parent-Teacher-Student conferences.

It is appropriate at this time to reflect on all the effort and progress that children will have made over the first semester or half year of school. This is the mid-point evaluation of learning, and it provides a good indicator for continued progress in the second semester.

Teachers provide detailed evaluation of each child's engagement in the learning process and will be able to talk further about this with parents at the conferences. We aim for children to also be able to talk about their learning. In schools this is called developing student agency, with children being more aware and involved in understanding their learning progress and next steps.



Teachers also provide an indication of how well children are meeting general expectations for their Year Level. We indicate *Above*, *At* or *Below* Expectations. Most teachers would say this information is less important for the child than the detailed evaluation of effort and achievement, and the comments written by the teacher about the child's attitude and social development.

Please celebrate your child's success when you receive the written report and when you meet with the teacher. Tell them you are proud of their effort.

Please remember that school is closed on Tuesday 6 July for the 3 Way conferences to take place.




Parents will need to make arrangement for their children to stay home except when they come to school for their conference.






#### **Enviro Pamphlet**

If you do come through the gates when they are closed, please ensure you close them after you.








The gate leading from the carpark to the library will also be closed.


