Disruptions to Teaching

Local schools, including Tirimoana, are currently experiencing another wave of COVID infections among our teachers. This means that some classes have had disruption to the normal teaching with other staff and relief teachers covering classes. At this stage, we are hopeful that most of these teachers will have returned to school by the end of this week or on Monday of next week. Despite this, children have been well taught and supported.

It is timely to remind parents to keep your children home when they are unwell, and if you have a positive case of COVID in your household to let school know. We do not pass this information on to others but it helps us to manage cases in our school. The same message applies with Winter colds and flu.

Head Lice

Head lice are going around currently. Please be vigilant and check your children's hair. Long hair is best tied up and away from the face.

The school office has nit treatment shampoo available for purchase. If you need extra support, the Public Health Nurse is able to assist in treatment. Please see Mrs Matthews.

Road Safety Concerns

A reminder that under New Zealand law:

- All children under seven years of age must use an approved child restraint appropriate for their age and size.
- Children aged seven must be secured in a restraint if one is available in the vehicle.
- Best practice is to keep a child in a booster seat until they reach 148cm
- Seatbelts must be worn by all other passengers in a vehicle if they are available.



We are seeing too many children and adults not appropriately restrained in cars and vehicles when coming to and from school. Drivers have a responsibility to ensure this law is upheld.
