TEACHER ONLY DAY

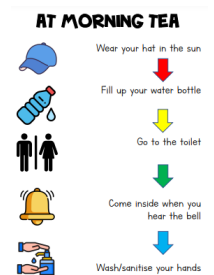
Teacher Only Day - Tuesday 7 June

Samoan Language Week - Vaiao o le Gagana Samoa

Talofa, susu mai, afio mai, maliu mai!

The theme for this week is 'Fa'a'au'au le Folauga i le Va'a o Tautai – Continue the Voyage with Competent Wayfinders of the Ocean'.

This year's theme reflects the journey of revitalising and maintaining Gagana Samoa. It also recognises the importance of having the right tools, leadership skills, relationships and va'a that adapt to faring the ocean and its elements.

Samoan is the second most common language spoken in Auckland reflecting the significant Samoan community living here. At Tirimoana School, we have nearly 60 students (8.5%) who identify as Samoan. Whaea Kura leads a Gagana Samoa class for an hour, once a week and Samoan culture is reflected strongly in our school Pasifika Group.



Getting Back to Normal

Over the week two events have reminded us of the importance of getting back to normal. Our Year 1 classes visited the Museum, and our senior football teams played in the inter-school zonal tournament. This would have been the first ever school trip for our 5 year olds (and actually last week, the first ever for our Year 2 and Year 3 students).

Feedback from staff and parents was that our students behaved very well at the Museum and enjoyed their learning visit.

Our football teams played in the first zonal tournament for 2 years, with our A Team coming first and our Girls Team runners-up. Great results!



Winter is Officially Here!

Yesterday was the first of June and marked the official start of winter. Although we start the winter with mild temperatures, we know the colder weather is only days away. Children need to be wearing shoes and warm Tiri jackets, as well as bringing raincoats on rainy, wet days. The office has supplies of warm Tiri beanies and regular school uniform items.
