Keeping Ourselves Safe at School

Following advice from the Ministry of Education all schools are requiring mask wearing indoors for children in Year 4-6 classes, and for staff. This is to slow the spread of COVID in the community with higher than expected rates of infection around the country.

As well as mask wearing indoors, we are increasing regular cleaning of surfaces, handwashing and sanitiser use, and we have air purifiers in many spaces. At this stage we are aiming for 4 weeks of extra care, and hopefully by 19 August we can remove the mask wearing requirement.

As always, families may inform teachers that their children are exempt from wearing a mask or that they do not want their children to wear a mask for a variety of special reasons. Teachers will not pressure children to wear a mask but they will have plenty of spare masks for children that want them.

Property News

Our school has begun a project to replace and to add new fences and gates around the school. This project will take at least a month to complete and will include new fencing and gates across the front of the school. This project is funded by the Ministry of Education and is aimed at improving school security.

We also repainted bright coloured court markings on our big flagpole court to refresh our playground and to create play features for children.

We have now removed the can and clothing recycling bins from the front entrance of the school. Please do not drop off any recycling from now onwards.

Education Review Office (ERO)

This term our school will welcome the commencement of a 4-6 month review of the school by the Education Review Office. Our school was last reviewed in 2016 with an excellent review report. ERO has now changed its format for reviews, with an Evaluation Partner working alongside the board and senior leadership team to identify strengths and areas for ongoing improvement over the next 3 years. A School Profile Report will be published late this year confirming outcomes from the review.

- "Transactions" will show all your top-ups and purchases.
- Remember to check the cut off time for your providers. To view cut-off times and menus – go to "Menus" under "Families" on the Home Page.
- If your child is unwell or can't attend school, log into Lunchonline, click on to the order for this day-you will see a cancel button. This must be done before the providers cut off time for ordering (most providers are 9am on the day of delivery, but some vary - check with your school).








Music Education Centre
