This week's PB4L Focus: Quiet Play Zones



This week classes have been focused on where are our quiet play zones? How do we need to behave in these spaces and what are some suitable activities learners can do in a quiet zone? Quiet zones are important for learners to be able to retreat to when they are feeling overwhelmed. It gives them time to calm and take control of their emotions again. You could continue this conversation with your child at home and discuss appropriate ways for them to use the "Quiet Play Zones" at school.

Class Lists and Teachers for 2023

We are now beginning the big task of allocating children to classes for the 2023 school year. The first step is confirming teachers for classes. We have almost completed this exercise, with just 2 places still to confirm. Some of our teachers will be changing teaching year levels next year.

The second step is for children to share with teachers the names of their best friends so that wherever we place children next year, we can place them with at least one close friend. This will happen next week.

We know that sometimes a parent is aware of a clash between children that teachers might not know about. A parent may also have some specific concerns about learning and behavior.

Teachers consider the following factors when allocating children to a class:

- a balance of boys and girls
- a balance of abilities and achievement
- a balance of cultures and backgrounds
- student numbers, so that no class is too large
- friendships
- children who may do better if separated from others
- readiness for next step learning

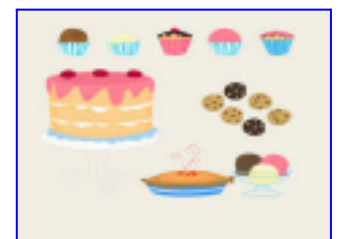
