This term began with disruptions due to the storms and cyclone that hit Auckland in late January. After that, we were able to establish normal routines with a focus on teaching and learning.

Children and staff will welcome a break to recharge their batteries ready for the second school term, which is usually a significant term for learning progress.

Over the holidays work will continue on construction of our new bike trail around the school field. We are hoping that we will be able to use this facility, including our own 60 new school bikes, for physical education and play next term.

School opens after the Easter/April holidays on Wednesday 26 April to start Term 2. On our first day back to school we will have a school ANZAC Assembly after lunch at 1.40pm. Children may wear their service uniforms, such as Guides, Scouts, Cadets, St John's Ambulance, to school for the special assembly.

# Attendance Matters: Sharing Term 1 Attendance Data with Whānau

### Our aim for 2023 is for all students to attend school for at least 90% of the school year.

Term 1 has shown us that 72% of students (438 students) had **regular attendance** of 90% or more - this means less than 5 days absent this term.

# Ka pai to the 115 students who had 100% attendance!

23% of students (136 students) had Irregular or Moderate attendance between 70-89%

5 % of our students (30 students)had **Chronic Attendance** and attended school less than 70 % of the time.

There may have been several factors that could contribute to Term 1's poor attendance:

- Many families have spent time overseas visiting family that they have not seen for over 3 years due to COVID restrictions
- Many students had more than 5 consecutive days sick
- Students did not return promptly to school after significant weather events

With your support we are aiming for better attendance rates in Term 2.

### Looking ahead to Term 2.

Next term we'll be adopting an approach used by the Education Review Office to gain a better understanding as to why some children have lower attendance rates.

Do not be surprised if your child may be asked what they like or dislike about school and what makes it hard (in their view) to get to school.

This will give us a better understanding of ways we may be able to help. We will be following up with parents to cross check any information. Any follow ups on attendance is with the parents and not with your child.



### **New Walking School Bus Routes**

We are hoping to establish new Walking School Bus routes next term. One Walking School Bus is proposed for children walking from Tirimoana Road, through the park to Cron Avenue, into Nui Mana Place and on into the school main entrance. A second route is proposed from McLeod Road East through Finlow Drive and into Divich Avenue/Metric Place entrance.
