Service

This week we have focused on recognising and promoting service to help others. Giving service creates happy and supportive communities.



On Wednesday we held our commemorative ANZAC assembly at school. Children learned about the service that men and women have given to our armed forces, from World War One onwards, to Kiwi peacekeepers working in crisis countries around the world. We paid tribute to children who belong to service groups such as Kea, Scouts, Brownies and St John's Ambulance. They wore their service uniforms at assembly. We also learned some history about ANZAC day.

At school we promote service with our senior students in roles such as Traffic Wardens, Care Ambassadors, Senior Student Leaders, Enviro leaders and Library monitors. Learning to give service to others is a valuable opportunity for children, and we hope that they will continue to provide service to others as they move through life.

Teaching is a service too. Although teachers are paid workers, their profession demands more, and is often viewed, like nursing and policing, as giving service to the community. We see ourselves as giving service.

This week a former student, now 31 years old, came back to school purposefully to thank me and his primary teachers, for the care, stability and trust that we gave him when he attended Tirimoana Primary School over 20 years ago. He shared how important his formative years were. It made me reflect about my own leadership and service.

If the school doesn't hear from you, we will get in touch with you to make sure your child is okay.


If your child is away for more than 3 days without you contacting us, the classroom teacher will contact you to see how your child is doing.


