Te wiki o te reo Māori runs from 11-17 Hepetema (September)

Every year since 1975 New Zealand has marked Māori Language Week. This is a time for all New Zealanders to celebrate te reo Māori (the Māori language) and to use more Māori phrases in everyday life.

The theme of Kia Kaha Te Reo Māori — making the language stronger - continues this year, picking up from where it left

off in 2022. The campaign is an essential piece of the puzzle to achieving the goal of 1 million speakers of te reo Māori in 2040.

At Tirimoana School our teachers:

- Use Māori words and phrases where appropriate and encourage correct pronunciation
- Explore Māori concepts, values and viewpoints, and their relevance
- Integrate te reo Māori and tikanga across the curriculum through planned and incidental learning experiences
- Teach children to create and recall their personal pepeha
- Teach children karakia and waiata
- Engage in their own personal learning of te reo Maori

Further opportunities at Tirimoana School for akonga/learners:

- Kapa Haka group
- Two day Bilingual class (Years 4-6) Te Reo Oranga
- Weekly extension te reo Maori lessons in the senior school
- Annual noho marae (Year 5)
- Lead teacher of te reo Maori

Some phrases you might like to use at home.

- Kia ora Hello
- Morena Good morning
- Tēnā koe Hello to one person
- Kia ora/Tēna korua Hello to two people
- Kia ora tātou/kia ora koutou Hello everyone
- Tēnā koutou Greetings to you (said to three or more people)
- Nau mai, haere mai Welcome
- Kei te pēhea koe? How are you?
- Kei te pai Good
- Tino pai Really good
- Ka kite anō See you later
- Mā te wā See you next time
- Haere rā Goodbye/farewell (said to someone leaving)
- Hei kona rā Goodbye (said to someone staying)
- As well as being used as a greeting, kia ora is also a general expression of appreciation.
- Tēnā koe (to one person), tēnā korua (to two people), or tēnā koutou (to three or more people) also means thank you in Māori.



Pertussis (whooping cough) is currently causing concern in our community.

Symptoms include:

- Runny nose
- Fever

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- Dry cough that turns into long coughing attacks.
 - In young children, the coughing ends with a 'whoop' sound.
- Children may be sick or gag, and babies can stop breathing.

Infants under 12 months are most at risk, but it can still be distressing for older children and adults.


