This week's PB4L Focus:

This week Year 3 - 6 learners have been discussing how to act responsibly while out of school grounds at Water Safety lessons. Thinking about ways to be responsible for their own belongings, and demonstrating responsibility when in a new learning environment. Y1 - 2 classes have focused on PB4L learning that is specific to their class. Discuss with your child ways to act responsibly especially when they are in a new learning environment.

This weekend New Zealand celebrates Labour Day on Monday 23rd October. School will therefore be closed on Monday. Labour Day commemorates the establishment of a 40 hour working week in 1899, for most workers, and traditionally is a time to acknowledge the ways in which we recognise Workers Rights.
