Best wishes to all our Indian Kiwi families for a happy Diwali. This is an important festival for the Indian community and is widely celebrated here in New Zealand, in India and in countries around the world. Here at Tirimoana School we have over 80 children who identify as Indian Kiwis.

Diwali

Diwali is India's biggest and most important holiday of the year. The festival gets its name from the row (avali) of clay lamps (deepa) that Indians light outside their homes to symbolize the inner light that protects them from spiritual darkness. This festival is as important to Hindus

as the Christmas holiday is to Christians. During Diwali celebrations people light up their houses, exchange sweets, wear new clothes, visit family and friends and light fireworks.

Roberts Road / Te Atatu Road Intersection : Work Starting Next Week

The intersection of Roberts Road and Te Atatu Road is being upgraded to a signalised intersection with traffic lights, including safe crossings for those who walk or cycle in this area.

Auckland Transport have been asked to upgrade this intersection to make it safer for those who are wanting to turn out of Roberts Road onto Te Atatu Road, especially at busy times.

There will be improvements made to the crossing at the shops and to the footpaths during the works to make sure cyclists and pedestrians, especially children, access their local amenities safely.

This work is being done as a part of the Te Atatu T2 Lanes project and will include changing the layout of Te Atatu Road to provide an extra lane. This will serve as a T2 lane towards the motorway.

Whilst the intersection works are underway, it is a good idea to plan ahead and allow a little more time for your journey in the area.
