At Tirimoana School we have 17 students who identify as Tongan . Mālō e lelei.

If you'd like to give Tongan a try, here are some phrases you can use with your children at home:

Hello :The most common greeting in Tonga is 'Mālō e lelei' (Hello). Thank you in Tongan:Mālō
Happy birthday :Ma'u ha 'aho fiefie
Good morning :Mālō tau ma'u e pongipongi ni
I love you:'Oku ou 'ofa 'ia koe
How are you?:Fēfē hake?
Response to How are you:Sai pē, mālō, fēfē koe?
Goodnight:'Alu a

Walking School Bus (WSB) Cron Reserve - Mornings




The Cron Reserve walking school bus started this week. It has been great to see children and families walking to school.


