Student Reports on Achievement and Progress

At the end of last term, and over the recent holidays, teachers worked on preparing Student Reports. These will be sent home with children tomorrow.

These reports may look a little different to previous years. This year, we have brought reports to parents earlier than in the past, from July to May. The reason for this are:

- The reports give parents an indication, after one term of learning, of how children have settled into their new class and new Year Level.
- Reporting in May gives teachers and parents plenty of time to address any concerns about learning or behaviour.
- The reports include assessment and testing information for parents, which were completed in Term One. This is a new feature in our reports.



Please read your child's report and the insert which describes how to understand the report. We hope that parents will talk with their children about the report, congratulating children on their success and acknowledging areas for improvement.

Parents and whanau will have the opportunity to talk about the report with teachers at parent interviews next week (Tuesday and Wednesday).

Bully Free NZ: "Pink Shirt Day 16th May"

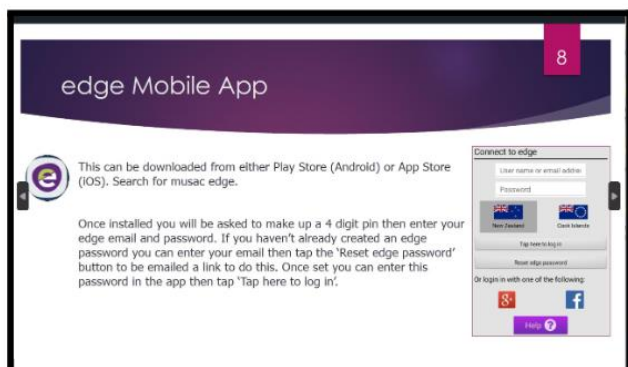
Graduate Profile Skill: Social Skills - I have friends and I am a friend to others, I am a Team player, I include others. Citizenship - I help others, I contribute to the school.
