Measles

You may have seen in the news media this week that there has been a case of Measles in the West Auckland Community. In light of this, it's important to remember how we can all help prevent the spread of this illness. Te Whatu Ora emphasizes that immunisation is the most effective way to protect yourself and our community. To be fully protected, a person needs two doses of the Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) vaccine. This vaccine is highly effective, stopping 99% of people who receive two doses from getting infected, reducing the risk of spreading the illness, and preventing severe complications. The MMR vaccine is free for all tamariki aged 18 and under, and for adults over 18 who are eligible for free local healthcare. Please talk to your healthcare provider to ensure you and your whānau are fully protected.
